

The Trulli Farmhouse – Charming Agriturismo Farmhouse: Puglia

Summary

This is our most rustic and romantic farmhouse in Puglia, converted from several 'trulli' (the characteristic conical shaped houses for which Puglia is so famous). It offers great value accommodation and a perfect base for exploring. The Trulli Farmhouse is situated a little inland, where the olive groves melt into terraces of vineyards and rolling farmland. It is set in one of our favourite valleys and we chose this charming little hotel for its unrivalled views over it.

Details

Clinging to the steep valley sides, you can spot clusters of trulli, reached by stone walled lanes, dotted all over Puglia. The Trulli Farmhouse is one such trullo, whose structure dates back to the 17th century. Its owners are the Matri family who have farmed in this valley for generations. Their son, Oronzo, named after the patron saint of the pretty nearby town of Ostuni, will be your host. The trulli at the farmhouse form its agriturismo restaurant, where wholesome fresh farm produce is used for the regional dishes. The huge stone fireplaces and rustic wooden chairs and tables, which also spill out onto the decked veranda, complete the rural picture.

Guest rooms are off a small flagged courtyard and are set in period stone cottages with vaulted ceilings. Holding up to 5 people, they have been freshly refurbished and fitted with simple modern furniture.
